

# New Visualizations for State Risk-Standardized Performance

Child and Family Services Reviews (CFSR) Data Profiles include statewide data indicators on safety and permanency and are provided to states by the Children’s Bureau twice per year. They display a state’s Risk-Standardized Performance (RSP), RSP interval, observed performance, and data quality check results. The Round 4 CFSR Data Profiles include a new page that visualizes a state’s RSP for the most recent 6-month period compared to national performance, along with a chart visualizing performance on each indicator over time. 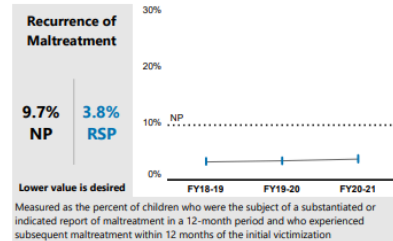
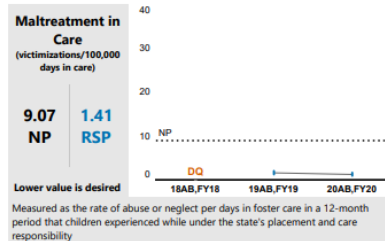

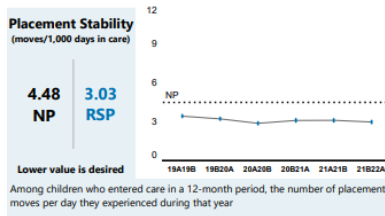
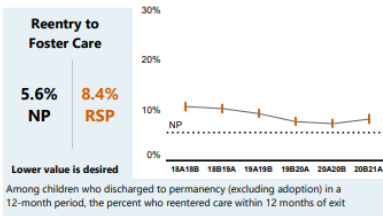
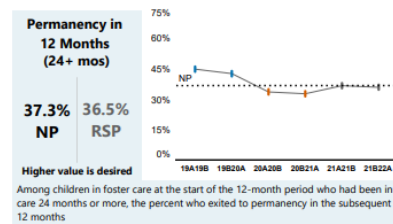
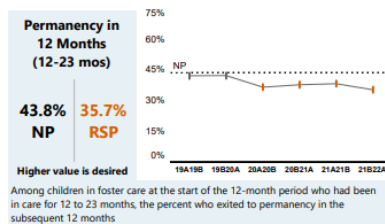
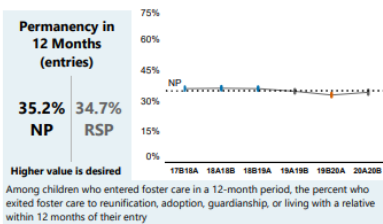
## Risk-Standardized Performance Visualization

Risk-Standardized Performance (RSP) is the percent or rate of children experiencing the outcome of interest, with risk adjustment. The vertical bars in the line graph represent the lower RSP and upper RSP of the 95% RSP (confidence) interval, and national performance (NP) is the dotted black line.

#### Performance Key

- State’s performance (using RSP interval) is statistically better than national performance.
- State’s performance (using RSP interval) is statistically no different than national performance.
- State’s performance (using RSP interval) is statistically worse than national performance.
