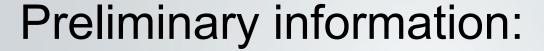

- Challenges with these items include themes around lack of contact or engagement with:
 - Fathers
 - Parents who are incarcerated or in inpatient substance abuse treatment
- Challenges in performance:
 - In foster care cases
 - · With fathers
 - In addressing needs (vs. assessing needs)
- Challenges in foster care cases tend to be in cases where children are older than 6 years old at the time the case opens
