Round 4 Year 1 States Are Gearing Up!

Round 4 Year 1 states are gearing up for their onsite reviews. Several Year 1 states have submitted their Statewide Assessments and others have begun working on them. The first Round 4 CB-Led Reviews in 2023 will be in Kansas (April 17–21), Puerto Rico (May 8–12), and Missouri (July 24–28). The first State-Led Reviews will be in Delaware, Indiana, and Massachusetts (all between April 1 and September 30, 2023). Resources:

New Mock Case Course Released on E-Learning Academy

The Layla Morgan Mock Case course is now on the Round 4 <u>E-Learning Academy</u> (ELA). The course is accredited through the National Association of Social Workers for 4 continuing education (CE) contact hours. It is available to all Round 4 ELA users and includes access to the Mock State Child Welfare Information System (MSCWIS), which stores case documents for online access. The course also provides an Online Monitoring System training site for each ELA user that can be used to create and rate the mock case.

Each ELA course includes a quiz that enrolled learners must pass with a score of 80 percent or better. After passing the quiz, the learner must also complete a course evaluation form before receiving a continuing education certificate, which may be printed or saved as a PDF.

New Round 4 FAQs Posted

New frequently asked questions (FAQs) have been posted on the portal regarding siblings of a target child who has had parental rights terminated but remains in foster care; visitation during short periods of separation; and how to correctly identify the role of a child's legal guardian(s).

The OSRI FAQ page provides responses from the Children's Bureau to questions regarding the Round 4 Onsite Review Instrument and Instructions (OSRI). The questions and their responses are organized by the seven CFSR outcome areas, with an additional "General Questions" category for questions related to the general application of the instrument as a whole and the instrument's Face Sheet section. Only users who have logged into the portal may submit questions.

Child Welfare Reviews Project Upcoming Presentations

- At the Child Welfare League of America's April 2023 National Conference, "Stronger Together: Uniting to Advance Change," a workshop, "Promising Practices to Strengthen Engagement With Young People With Lived Experience." Respecting youth with lived experience and regarding them as experts is a critical step toward improved child and family outcomes. This workshop will present results from a qualitative study in which 18 youth with lived expertise were asked about the best methods for recruiting, engaging, supporting, and retaining youth in child welfare monitoring efforts, such as the Child and Family Services Reviews. Promising practices for engaging youth will be discussed so attendees may apply lessons learned in their own work.
